

Event Description:

This will be the 36th Annual Courage Classic Bicycle Tour benefiting Children's Hospital Colorado. We will have a two-day event and plan to ride through the Town of Keystone on July 20th. The Aid Station location we would like to request permits for in the Town of Keystone is Keystone Pika Lot (Keystone Resorts) on 7/20/25. Riders and volunteers will also access roads/rec paths in the Town of Keystone. We would like to drop off portable toilets, a trash dumpster and a recycling dumpster at each location as early as 7/18/25 and items will be removed by 6pm the day of the event. Route signage will be placed on 7/19/25 starting at 8am and be removed by end of day on 7/20/25.

Keystone Rd until the rec path becomes available – across the road from Mountain House. Riders will stay on the rec path the rest of the way through Keystone.
