## **Emergency: Thunderstorms / Lightning**

Lightning is the primary severe weather concern in mountain regions like Keystone.

Follow the "30/30 Rule": If thunder occurs within 30 seconds of lightning, suspend all activities and seek shelter.

## **Primary Shelter Locations:**

- Vehicles: All attendees and staff should immediately return to their personal or parked vehicles, as vehicles offer excellent protection from lightning.
- Designated Building Shelter:
  - Nearby buildings are secondary shelters. Staff will direct attendees accordingly.

## **Procedures:**

- 1. **Announce suspension of activities** via megaphone or PA system.
- 2. Event staff will guide attendees to the nearest vehicle or building shelter.
- 3. Remain sheltered for at least 30 minutes after the last thunderclap.
- 4. Emergency staff will monitor weather apps and NOAA alerts for real-time updates.

In the event of **any unexpected or unsafe situation**, attendees will be instructed to **return immediately to their own vehicles** and remain there until further notice.

## Important:

- If someone does **not have a vehicle**, they should report to the nearest **event staff member** to be safely escorted to a staff vehicle or designated secure area.
- Do not approach unknown vehicles or gather in groups.
